6th St Bridge Update

- 4 m wide
- 5% grade on ramps
- Roundabout in Simms Park
- 4.4 million cost estimate at this time
- · Public art will be part of the project on the tower, roundabout, lookout deck and crosswalk
- 50% design completed and in review
- Detailed design should be finished this summer.
- Most important to have a "shovel ready" project before applying for grants
- · Will only proceed based on Grant funding
- · Construction in 2023 or 2024.

Education

□ Safe cycling education provided in the Valley by CVCCo since 2010
□ We provide Education for both children and adults
□ Coordination with schools & volunteers by our Bike Rodeo
Coordinator in 2021 – Lauren Lan, and Adult Education Coordinator Marg Harris
Children's Education :
$\hfill \square$ We continue to focus on grade 4 & 5 students in all schools in SD #71 which requires a Rodeo at each school every 2 years
$\hfill\Box$ We do 7 schools each school year, 3 in the fall and 4 in the Spring.
$\hfill \Box$ We have over 600 students go through the program in a normal year.
☐ Approximately 15 volunteers are required for each School program. We are always looking for more.

□ Lauren Lan is our new School Cycling Program/Bike Rodeo Coordinator. Under her direction we have expanded the program to 2 days to now include biking skills as well as cycling safety and have rebranded this to the "School Cycling Program".
Adult Education:
☐ We now have 6 trained instructors for the Ride Right Course.
□ Coordinated by Marg Harris
□ We offered courses through Elder College in the Fall and are offering again this Spring.
$\ \square$ We also did a requested session with CVRD and SD71 staff in the fall.
$\hfill \square$ Intend to utilize a BCCC grant to provide more courses and encourage more confident, safe cyclists in the Valley
Promotion:
□ New Website last year created by Unicycle Digital

☐ Have just hired a digital marketing person to make us more visible to all.
□ Articles in the Record and Letters to the Editor
□ Representation at community forums and events Equipment
□ Trailer & bikes are well maintained thanks to our volunteers, and safely stored thanks to John van der Vliet
□ Did some upkeep on the roof of the trailer
□ More fittings purchased to increase our inventory of bike racks for when we have Events again!
Special Events:
□ Due to Covid this past year, all our major fundraising events were cancelled.
☐ This year, we are already scheduled for the Snow to Surf & Filberg Festival, likely the Musicfest and hopefully more.
☐ We did, however, manage to participate in the Healthy Comox Listening event in September at the Filberg Park.
Proposed bylaw amendments
The following special resolution was presented for a vote by the membership.

Be it resolved that the following changes be made to the bi-laws of the society:

2.6 A person's membership in the Society is terminated if the person is not in good standing for

3 consecutive months.

Previously allowed members 6 months to renew.

3.7 The quorum for the transaction of business at a general meeting is 10 voting members.

Previously only required 3 members for quorum.

6.3 The president is the chair of the Board and is responsible for supervising the other directors in the

execution of their duties. It is recommended that nominees for the position of President have had prior board experience with the Society.

Passed unanimously.
