5. Infrastructure Advocacy

Bike Counters

Mike to speak with CVRD about whether they have any interest in a joint purchase of a multi mode counter for pedestrian/cyclist counts. Perhaps have Urban Systems draw up a suggested location and time interval count plan for machine and in person counts going forward as part of the ATNP? Will inquire and bring back to board.

- Other Active Transportation Groups

 Communication improvements with groups such as Accessibility Advisory Ctte, Road Runners, etc who are also key users of active transportation.
If we can garner support from more groups/people it has more weight with municipal governments.

Komox First Nations

 Lawrence to send a letter to let them know about our advocacy in Valley and we would like to meet to understand their needs. Also ask if they have any thoughts how to solve dangerous part of Condensory Rd.

Meeting with CoC Councillors Dec 21/20

 Councilors worried about budget issues. Expressed our dismay at lack of communication that this item was even coming to council let alone that it would be voted on and a width set in stone that night. Need 5 votes to reopen the issue, seems unlikely to gather the political will at this point.

- CoC Council Presentation re 6th St Bridge - Jan 18 2021

- Mike/Lawrence presented to council in hopes of having them re-think the 4m bridge width they voted on Dec 9.
- Received well but Clr Theos questioned the general legitimacy of the active transportation counts from 2019. Cole-Hamilton said he supports Dan Casey's recommendation of 3.5-4m width (Urban Systems Report) as they wrote the book on AT. Hillian suggested we fund raise to get a wider bridge.
- Follow up meeting with Chris Davidson Jan 25 went ok. We laid out why we felt our engagement with them was lip service. He didn't apologize but said he would like to have frank meetings with us more often. He can't change council recommendation for 4m bridge deck and within 1-2 months they will be spending structural engineering design money that needs a specific width so we don't have much time to change width without costing us some money.
