


HIGHLIGHTS

Close to 100 people came out to hear the exciting program of speakers at the Comox Valley Cycling Coalition Annual General Meeting on Monday February 29th. Guest speaker, Bill McKay, chair of the Island Corridor Foundation and Mayor of Nanaimo, gave a dynamic presentation about the history and current status of the railway link between Courtenay and Victoria and the associated 'trail by rail'.

He linked this with a vision for increased use of alternative transportation in Nanaimo and displayed the city's z-map showing both cycling and transit routes on a pocket sized map.

Local speakers, representing all four Comox Valley jurisdictions, detailed plans and goals for improved cycling infrastructure and a cycling network providing connectivity throughout the valley. Barbara Price (Town of Comox councillor), outlined some of the improved cycling infrastructure that Comox has implemented in the last few years, David Frisch (City of Courtenay councillor), shared some of the transportation ideas he learned about at workshops and meetings in the capital city – which is the second coldest in the world. He displayed a few charts that showed cycling lanes in Ottawa were actually fairly well used, even in the height of winter. Rob Crisfield (operations manager for the Village of Cumberland), shared plans for the upcoming improvements Cumberland has planned, especially on the well used Cumberland Road and Karin Albert (CV Regional District parks planner), showed the importance of the links between cycling trails and urban bicycling routes. Presentations were illustrated with maps and pictures and described the positive responses to surveys they have received from the public.


