Joining us at this year's AGM were Andy Telfer (pictured on the left) and Richard Campbell (seen here on the right) from the British Columbia Cycling Coalition (BCCC). The BCCC, working with project partners that include the Comox Valley Cycling Coalition and Friends of Rails to Trails Vancouver Island, is conducting the Mid Vancouver Island Cycling Feasibility Study to explore the opportunities and viability for improving cycling transportation, recreation and tourism in the Mid Vancouver Island Region. Both on and off-road cycling opportunities are being explored.

They asked attendees at the AGM to go on line to the Comox Valley Cycling and Walking Survey to provide input which will help identify cycling & walking priorities, trails, routes, barriers and potential future projects to enable everyone to cycle & walk for their daily trips, recreation and vacation.
